NEW DISPATCHERS, NEW VOICES

Over the last few months, we have hired a couple of new dispatchers to fill vacancies. New hires include Brendan Bobo and Kyle Jones. They are filling vacancies left by Tony Gregor, who was promoted to Supervisor, and Brock

Williams, who will be leaving us to work full time at the Cumberland Trail Fire District. Brock will remain on staff as a part time dispatcher.

ACTIVE 911

Due to a recent update of our Computer Aided Dispatching (CAD) software, enhancements have been made to the information that you will receive over Active911 alerts. These enhancements include Company or Business names, location coordinates (if provided), CAD Call Number, complete Cross Streets, and the date/time of the call from CAD. As a reminder, Active911 is administered by the Belmont County Fire and Squad Officers Association, NOT Belmont County 9-1-1. We still receive calls here every week asking for activation of devices and device codes. That is not provided through 9-1-1. Your contact for those things will be Jim Delman or Allan Ketzell III with the BCFSOA.

MONTHLY CALL NUMBER REPORT

At the end of this newsletter, we will continue to provide you with the monthly call numbers for each department in Belmont County. As a reminder, your numbers may differ from what we report. Our report represents the number of calls that a department is associated with in the CAD. This means if your department was dispatched to a call, but didn't respond, we still show it as one call for your agency. Your department may not have a record of that call, since no one responded.

BELMONT COUNTY ONLINE MAPPING

Recently, the Belmont County GIS Department has published an online county mapping website that is available for public use. The new website can be found at <http://belmont-oh.bhamaps.com/>. It can be accessed from any computer or device with internet access. This brings together a majority of the GIS information in use by the county and data from the Belmont County Auditor. It includes all road centerlines, 911 house numbers, parcel data from the Auditor, tax mapping, voting precincts, hydrant locations and much more. These "map layers" can be turned on and off, depending on the user's preference. The web mapping is updated on a monthly basis, so the most recent updates to things like newly issued addresses, parcel information and well pad locations are current with the county's records. Please take the time to visit the site and look around. It is a very nice resource available to anyone who needs it.

CODE RED ALERTS

If you have not done so, please take the time to visit our website, www.belmontcounty911.com, and sign up your cell phone or VoIP home phone for CodeRED alerts. These types of phones are NOT automatically in our database. There is a link on the front page of the website for signing up. You can choose to receive Emergency alerts, General alerts and various Weather alerts. CodeRED is used to disseminate important information to all Belmont County residents, when situations arise. Additionally, there is a CodeRED mobile app available for download, which can notify you of alerts here in Belmont County or as you travel through other areas using the CodeRED system.
